

Such an aim needs to be achieved in steps and each step depends on a range of technologies as well as a suitable policy and regulatory framework, and also initial investment. To help clarify this process, this workshop will bring together experts from the chemical sector, the waste disposal sector and the semiconductor sector to discuss an integrated approach to [some] recycling, the actions needed and the potential benefits.

Improving government performance in procurement and value for money

The government, and particularly the Treasury, prioritises budgetary control but too often, once initial contracts have been awarded, costs escalate without adequate cost or quality control. Whatever the cause, it is clear that improving government

performance on procurement, and ensuring suppliers deliver good value for money, would bring big benefits. Meg Hillier MP, Chair of the Public Accounts Select Committee, who has extensive experience of overseeing public expenditure, will lead a discussion on how government procurement could be improved to provide better value for money and contract control.

Other meetings, currently in planning include:

- Improving our digital infrastructure would be a win/win for businesses and the economy
- Reforming UK corporate governance is key to invigorating the UK economy

Adjusting to new defence procurement priorities

Russia's invasion of Ukraine has completely changed the European defence landscape, and UK defence priorities. Providing weapons and munitions to Ukraine and strengthening UK capability in the European theatre will require budget

increases and the increased speed and volume of new defence equipment availability. This means that defence equipment manufacturers will need to rapidly increase capacity to supply to Ukraine and countries who wish to increase stocks and modernise equipment. This, in turn, will put pressure on the procurement capabilities of the Ministry of Defence to make good value purchases of reliable equipment with appropriate interoperability and maintenance characteristics. Shadow Minister for Defence Procurement, Chris Evans MP led this Industry Forum roundtable on 'Adjusting to new defence procurement priorities.'

Real solutions to UK housing problems

As the government focuses on its five core missions, it is clear that long-term problems remain in the provision of adequate housing in the UK. For example: First time buyers find it hard to afford housing, particularly in the south east, rental costs and tenancy terms make long-term family renting difficult, and the provision of social housing has declined, but not the need. Together, these cause serious inequality and also impact UK economic performance. Matthew Pennycook MP, Shadow Minister for Housing and Planning, led an Industry Forum roundtable on 'Real solutions to UK housing problems'.
